Reflection: Trying to lure him from his destiny
Nelson Mandela tells us that when he was struggling to
establish himself as a young lawyer in Johannesburg,
he was friendly with a businessman by the name of
Hans Muller, a man who saw the world through the
prism of supply and demand. One day Muller pointed
out the window, and said, 'Look out there, Nelson. Do
you see those men and women scurrying up and down
the street? What is it that they are pursuing? What is it
that they are working for so feverishly? I'll tell you: all
of them, without exception, are after wealth and mon-

ey. Because wealth and money equal happiness. That is what you must struggle for: money, and nothing but money. Once you have enough money, there is nothing else you will want in life.'

The advice was well-meant. But that only made it all the more dangerous. Mandela was an intelligent man. If he had taken Muller's advice he could have done very well for himself. Luckily for South Africa, he didn't. Instead of looking after Number One, Mandela decided to dedicate himself to serving his country.

This incident helps us to understand today's Gospel. A short time prior to this Peter had recognized Jesus as the Messiah. Now, according to popular expectation, the Messiah would be a great military leader—another King David who would restore Israel to its former military greatness. No doubt this is the kind of thing Peter had in mind.

But this wasn't Jesus' idea of the Messiah. He told the apostles that the Messiah would suffer and be put to death. That was what God wanted. Not that God wanted the suffering of his Son but that he wanted to show us the depth of his love for us in and through the faithfulness and love of his Son, a faithfulness and love which cost him his life.

Jeremiah didn't know what he was letting himself in for when he agreed to become God's prophet. When Mandela decided to dedicate his life to his country, he didn't know what it would mean spending twenty-seven years of his life in prison. But when Jesus set out on the road to Jerusalem he did not know the full consequences of the decision he had made. This makes his sacrifice all the greater.

However, when the hour came for him to drink the cup of suffering and death, he didn't find it easy. On the contrary, he underwent a terrible agony, and asked the Father to remove the chalice from him. Nevertheless, he remained faithful.

Jeremiah underwent a similar struggle. He was so overwhelmed by the demands of his task that he wanted to pack it all in. His cry will find an echo in the heart of anyone who serves God in a difficult situation. It is never easy to bear witness in the face of indifference and hostility. Only a profound conviction of vocation can hold one to the task. But it is comforting for us to know that even a Jeremiah could contemplate opting out.

The only thing that makes sacrifice easy is love. Love enables us to turn the cross from a stumbling block into a stepping stone. What Jesus did was an expression of his love for us and for his heavenly Father.

The road to Jerusalem brought Jesus to Calvary. But it didn't end there. It led to Easter. Jesus supports all those who follow him down the narrow road of sacrifice, and shares his Easter victory with them.
