FIRST READING

A reading from the prophet Isaiah (5:1-7)

(The vineyard of the Lord God of hosts is the House of Israel).

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave.

And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead?

Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He

expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Reflection:

Ingratitude ...

Peter and Anne raised four children but are now alone. They feel disappointed and sad. Anne tells us why.

'We did everything we could for those children. We wanted them to have the things we didn't have. We bought a house. Peter had to do a lot of overtime to be able to keep up with the mortgage repayments. Times were hard. Life was a constant struggle. Still, those children never lacked anything.

'Many's the night I didn't get a wink of sleep because of them. They had a lot of illnesses when they were young but, thank God, in time they grew out of them. Though we saw some of our neighbours going regularly to the pub, we hardly went out. We saw others going abroad for their holidays, but we could never afford to do that. But we gladly sacrificed these things for the sake of the children.

'We sent them to good schools. They never lacked money for books or school outings. They were always well dressed. We taught them good

values. We taught them their religion, and we tried to give them good example. And just look at how they have repaid us. They say that good example rubs off on the children. Well, in our case, it didn't.

'John (the oldest) quit university and went into the pub business. He works hard, and by all accounts is doing well. He now owns three pubs. But money has become his god. Though he sends us a couple of bottles at Christmas, we hardly ever see him. 'Anne, a teacher, married a fellow with a big job. They don't believe in having children. They rarely come to see us, though we get cards from them from exotic places. 'Peter has three children and seemed to be happily married. But then he suddenly left his wife, and went with a young girl. He never shows up. 'Paul, our baby, is still unmarried. He's touring the world like a hippie. Doesn't believe in working or settling down. Last word we got from him, he was somewhere in Australia.

'None of them go to Church. Now what more could we have done for them? Do we deserve to be treated like this?' There is great heart-break for religious parents who see their children abandoning the faith and/or adopting a lifestyle which they regard as immoral. How hard it is to go on loving them in spite of it all. Even when we do favours out of the goodness of our heart, we expect a return, and are hurt when it doesn't come. It's only natural. We feel taken for granted or even used.

Today's readings seem to suggest that even God sometimes feels like this. The words of the First Reading, 'What more could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done?' is a cry from the heart. In spite of all the love he showed his people, Israel, all he got in return was utter ingratitude.

The people of Israel had been treated in a privilege manner by God. But privilege brings responsibility. They failed God. Yet God is not disappointed for his own sake. Rather he is disappointed because his people have squandered the blessings he wanted them to enjoy. Sadly, the vineyard is destined to become a wilderness.

What sort of fruits did God expect from his people? God looked for peace from his people, and got war; for true worship, and got idolatry; for justice in their dealings with one another, and got injustice, corruption, and exploitation of the poor and the weak; for goodness, and got evil; for caring and sharing, and got greed and acquisitiveness; for temperance, and got excessive eating and drinking; for community, and got exclusiveness and snobbery; for humility, and got pride; for wise and godly living, and got a pagan lifestyle.

This to some extent is our story too. God wants us to make use of the gifts and opportunities he has given us so that we can grow as his children. But often we fail to respond to his love. And yet, God doesn't write us off, but gives us chance after chance. Flor McCarthy, SDB


