Reflection:

The sleep of habit

Three times in today's Gospel passage Jesus urges his disciples to 'stay awake'. The call to 'stay awake' is meant for us too. It is a very appropriate call for the beginning of the liturgical year.

They say that the swallows return to the exact same nest each year. They travel all that way to end up in the same locality. What does this tell us about swallows? That they are creatures of habit.

Habit plays a big part in our lives. All of us, except the very young, are to a great degree creatures of habit. It is said that we live the second half of our lives according to the habits acquired during the first half. That will be comforting for those who have formed good habits. But it will be disturbing for those who have formed bad habits.

There is a positive side to habit. Repetition is necessary. It is a hard grind and a tough discipline, but it can bear fruit. Athletes have shown us that repetition can produce results. Only thus is a skill mastered. The most perfect actions are effortless, because through dent of habit, they have become second nature to us.

Nelson Mandela gives us an example of this. Writing about his time in prison, he says: 'To survive in prison, one must develop ways to take satisfaction in one's daily life. One can feel fulfilled by washing one's clothes, by sweeping a corridor...'

But there is a negative side to habit. There is a lot of repetition in life, especially in work. As a result of doing the same things day in and day out, we get into a rut, and end up doing things merely out of habit. This results in things being done absented-mindedly and in a casual, unthinking manner. There is no real heart or feeling in them. This is sad, and soul-destroying.

Furthermore, habits can be selfish. Habits are very hard to break, especially bad habits. We can get used to anything, even prison walls. First you hate them, then you get used to them, and then you depend on them.

If you place a frog in a pot of hot water, it will jump right out. But if you put a frog into pot of cold water that is slowly brought to the boil, the frog will just sit there. Its nervous system is so primitive, it needs a sudden jilt to realise that is in danger.

Maybe that is the purpose of Advent. It gives us a jolt. It issues a wake up call to us. It provides us with a chance to start again. We can easily become Christians by habit only. We may be just going through the motions, taking part in rituals that have lost all freshness and meaning. We don't hear the Gospel anymore. Advent calls us to wake up. To shake off the dust of routine and habit, and to let Christ come alive in our lives once more.
