A reading from the book of Genesis (22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18)

(The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith).

Reflection : God is in our side

St. Paul tells us that God is on our side. Therefore, neither suffering nor tragedy nor death should separate us from the love of God, a love which we have seen in Christ. Maya Angelu, the American poet and author, is a wise woman and a spiritual one too. She tells how one day she had a religious awakening. It happened in a very simple manner. She was in her twenties and had just moved to San Francisco. She says that at that time she was an acting agnostic. It wasn't that she had stopped believing God; it was just that God didn't seem to be around the neighbourhoods she frequented. Then a voice teacher introduced her to a book entitled Lessons in Truth.

She tells how one day the teacher asked her to read to him from the book: I was twenty-four, very erudite, very worldly. He asked me to read a section which ended with the words: "God loves me." I read the piece and closed the book, and the teacher said, 'Read it again.' I pointedly opened the book, and sarcastically read, 'God loves me.' He said, 'Again.' After about the seventh repetition I began to sense that there might be truth in the statement, that there was a possibility that God really did love me. Yes, me, Maya Angelou. Suddenly I began to cry the grandness of it all. I knew that if God loved me, then I could do wonderful things, I could try great things, learn anything, achieve anything. For what could stand against me when God was with me, since any person with God constitutes the majority.

For Maya Angelu, though she believed, God seemed very remote and unreal. It is only when she become convinced that God loved her that God became real for her. Then that belief energised her. Suddenly she felt that she could do anything, face anything, since God loved her and was with her. Jesus had just began his journey to Jerusalem. Up to this time he had been working mostly in Galilee. Even there, the area where he had grown up, he had met a lot of opposition from the religious leaders. But in going to Jerusalem he sensed that a violent death awaited him there. Naturally he recoiled from such a fate. It seems that it was to reflect on this and to pay about it, that he climbed to the top of Mount Tabor.

Jesus had a marvellous experience on that mountain. He heard those wonderful words: 'You are my beloved Son; I am pleased with you.' In other words, he knew that God loved him. This assurance would give him the strength to face the future whatever it held. Our problem is that as soon as we run into trouble our faith fails us. We think that God has abandoned us. But if we pray we will come realise that God has not abandoned us, but is present in our suffering.

At all times, but especially in times of difficulty, we should remember what St Paul says: 'God is on our side.' And with God on our side, we can face anything. To know that nothing can separate us from the love of God is our strength in times of weakness and our hope in times of adversity. In the face of pain, all we have to do is abandon ourselves to his care. Like Jesus on Tabor we too can experience rare moments of light and joy. We get glimpses of the promised land towards which we are travelling in faith. In his love for us, God allows us to taste on earth the joys of the world to come. **Sunday & Holy Day Liturgies**
