LITURGY OF THE WORD

Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

FIRST READING

A reading from the second book of Chronicles (36:14-16, 19-23)

(The wrath and the mercy of the Lord are revealed in the exile and liberation of his people).

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this

land has enjoyed its Sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep Sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.'

And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfill the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."'



Reflection: Nicodemus

Nicodemus is at the centre of today's Gospel. Even though he appears only three times in the Gospel Story (all three appearances occur in John), he is a very interesting character. He was a Pharisee, and a member of the Sanhedrin – the supreme court of the Jews.

The first time Nicodemus appears is in the Gospel passage we've just read. We are told that he was impressed by the teaching and deeds of Jesus. It was clear to him that the hand of God was in them. So he came to see Jesus, but did so under cover of darkness. Which suggests that he didn't want to be seen. But we shouldn't be too hard on him on this account. Given the fact that he was a Pharisee, it was a wonder he came at all. Jesus honoured him with a long interview.

By the time Nicodemus puts in his second appearance, opposition to Jesus had hardened. now the Pharisees had made up their minds to kill him, and were ready to do so without even giving him a trial. But Nicodemus intervened, declaring that Jesus should at least be given a fair hearing as the law demanded (Jn 7:51). This was a more public involvement with Jesus. And the third and last time Nicodemus appears is at the burial of Jesus. It was he who provided a large quantity of expensive spices for his burial (Jn 19:39)

What can we deduce about Nicodemus from these three brief appearances? The first appearance shows that he was an open-minded man, and a genuine seeker of the truth. The second appearance shows that he was a fair-minded man, when he insisted that Jesus should not be condemned without a trial. And the third appearance shows that he was a wealthy man, but also a generous and compassionate one.

All of these qualities we can admire and copy with profit. But what Nicodemus seems to have been unable to do was come straight out and make a full and public act of faith in Jesus. He doesn't seem to have had the courage to come out of the darkness and choose decisively for the light. We are left with the picture of a decent man, who could have been a great man. A mediocre person – neither a great saint nor a great sinner.

Reflecting on Nicodemus should challenge us to come out from the shadows, and not to be afraid or ashamed to profess openly our faith in Jesus, and to be ready to pay whatever price is required for Those who believe will not be lost, but doing so. will have eternal life. But it is not simply a matter of believing, but of living according to that belief.
