A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2:1-11)

(They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages).

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire.

Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

#### Reflection:

#### **BIRTHDAY GIFTS**

Americans are notoriously extravagant when it comes to birthday celebrations. Even though it was only his second birthday, Simon got over twenty presents. When the time came for him to open them, he sat on the floor and began to tear off the fancy wrappings. Once he had opened a gift, he examined it for a few seconds, then threw it aside and went on to the next. Instead of feeling happy for him, one felt sorry for him. He didn't need all those presents. He was being smothered with things when all he really wanted and needed was a little loving.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. On that day the apostles received the gifts of the Holy Spirit. But this doesn't mean they were like children receiving birthday gifts. The Holy Spirit didn't give the apostles any things. The Spirit did not bring them anything, or give them anything they did not already have.

Take the example of Spring. Spring doesn't give anything to the trees. All it does is help to bring out what is already within them in a germinal state. So it was with the apostles. What the Holy Spirit did was awaken them to the gifts that God had already given them. And what resulted was a marvelous sharing of their gifts — for the benefit of the infant Christian community.

Gifts are not given just for our own use. They are meant to be shared. Often people allow their gifts to lie idle. They may have great potential for goodness, but that potential is not released. To develop a gift calls for patience and self-discipline. But it leads to growth and joy. A tree is never more alive than when teeming with blossoms or with fruit.

The action of the Spirit is mysterious, but it's not magic. What is called for on our part is openness, willingness and effort. Fear, selfishness, laziness, apathy — all these lead to stagnation. What the Holy Spirit did for the apostles was to imbue them with courage and boldness so that they were able to overcome their fear and timidity. From being a group of people, huddled together in fear of each other and of the world at large, they became people with a mission and a message for the world — the Good News of Jesus Christ. After the coming of the Spirit they became living witnesses for Christ.

The Holy Spirit has been given to us too. Just as Spring enables the trees to blossom and grow, so the Holy Spirit enables us to be fruitful disciples of the Lord.
