REFLECTION:

A costly caring

Once a man went to see a friend of his who was a professor at a great university. However, as they sat chatting in the professor's office, they were continually interrupted by students who came knocking at the door, seeking the professor's advice about something or other. Each time the professor rose from his chair, went to the door, and dealt with the student's request. Eventually the visitor asked the professor, 'How do you manage to get any work done with so many interruptions?'

'At first I used to resent the interruptions to my work. But one day it suddenly dawned on me that the interruptions were my work,' the professor

That professor could have locked himself away and devoted his time to his own private work. In that way he would no doubt have had a quieter life. But being the generous and unselfish person that he was, he could not do that. Instead he made his work consist in being available to his students. It was no surprise that he was greatly loved by the students. And it was no coincidence that he was one of the happiest and most fulfilled professors on the campus.

An act of kindness is judged, not so much by its importance, but by the disruption it causes in the life of the one who does it. It's a great test of people when, at a drop of a hat, they put aside their own plans to help another person.

It's a consolation for us to know that Jesus too had to cope with interruptions. He too had his plans upset. Today's Gospel tell us that he was in such demand that he and his apostles scarcely had time to eat. However, at some point he decided that enough was enough, and took the apostles off to a quiet place for a break.

This time he wasn't thinking of himself but of his apostles. They ha just come back from the mission on which he had sent them. He saw that they needed a rest. So he decided to take them off to a quiet place. The carers too need to be cared for.

All of us are capable of caring. The need for caring people is great. Neglect is widespread in our society. There are many people in our world who are like sheep without the shepherd. When we care, we living the Gospel.

Good can come out of interruptions. They prevent us from becoming totally preoccupied with ourselves. Selfishness is a kind of prison. Love, on the other hand, sets us free. Helder Camara says: Accept surprises that upset your plans, shatter your dreams, give a completely different turn to your day and - Who know? - to your life. It's not chance. Leave God free to weave the pattern of your days.
