#### **Entrance Antiphon**

#### FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Genesis (2:18-24) (They were two in one flesh).

#### Reflection: The kingdom of childhood

Jesus says to us, 'Unless you become like little children you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.' We tend to regard childhood as something that we must grow out of, leave completely behind, as if there was nothing in it that was worth keeping.

We have to distinguish between being childlike and being childish. To be childish implies immaturity, throwing tantrums, being silly, being irresponsible... Children are not angels. These are things we should grow out of. But there are lovely childlike qualities which we should try to hold onto - openness, receptivity, sense of wonder, ability to live in the present...

Unfortunately what tends to happen is we lose some of the good qualities of the child and keep some of the worst. We cease to be childlike but continue to be childish. What have we lost with the loss of our youth?

Imagination is infinitely stronger in childhood. Every child is blessed with a sense of wonder. Their vision is so fresh and clear. Wordsworth put it beautifully: 'Heaven lies about us in our infancy.' Children are seeing everything as for the first time. Picasso's ambition was to paint like a child. He said that art should startle us into seeing the world anew like a child does.

Children teach us how to live. They have not yet got into grooves, or become prisoners of routine, habit, and prejudice. They are always themselves. This is what makes them so charming and unique.

Happiness is the natural state of little children. They have the capacity to wring enjoyment out of simple things. The shabbiest doll will delight a child's heart for half a year, but adults need so much more. Why? Because they have lost the soul of a child. It's one of the tasks of the Church to keep alive that soul.

Nothing is easier as life goes on than to grow old in heart, dry and disillusioned, cynical and selfish. Children put us in touch with the gentler and more innocent part of themselves that we may have discarded in the struggle or battle of life. They revive in us too a sense of wonder, and it is the sense of wonder above all that keeps us young.

When Jesus says to us, 'Unless you become like little children you will not enter the kingdom of heaven,' he is recalling us to our lost childhood, so that though old and frail in body, we might be reborn in innocence of character.

Jesus says we can't enter the Kingdom unless we receive it like a child. The kingdom is a gift. No one can enter the kingdom who is not open to receive it as a gift.


