#### **REFLECTION:** No one is without sin

Once upon a time a man was caught stealing and was brought before the king, who immediately gave orders that he be hanged. However, as he was being led to the gallows, the man told the prison governor that he knew a wonderful secret, which was taught him by his father. He claimed that using this secret he could plant the seed of a pomegranate and make it grow and bear fruit overnight. He said that it would be a pity if the secret died with him, and that he was willing to reveal it to the king.

The governor was so impressed that he halted the execution, and brought the man back before the king. There the man dug a hole in the ground, and taking a pomegranate seed said, 'Your Majesty, the seed must be planted by a person who has never taken anything that didn't belong to him. I being a thief cannot do it.' Then turning to one the king's officials he said, 'May be you would like to plant it.'

But the official refused, saying, 'In my younger days I kept something that didn't belong to me.' Then the man turned to king's treasurer and said, 'well then, may be you would like to plant it.' But the treasurer too refused, saying, 'Over the years I've handled a lot of money. Now and again I might have kept a little for myself.'

And so it went on. Finally there was only the king left. Turning to him the man said, 'Perhaps your majesty would do the honour of planting the seed.' But the king said, 'I am ashamed to say it, but once I kept a watch that belonged to my father.' Then the thief said, 'All of you are great and powerful people and want for nothing. Yet none of you can plant the seed, whilst I who have stolen a little because I was starving am about to be hanged.'

The king pardoned him. This story would have ended very differently if the king had not been prepared to listen. Instead, thanks to his patience and to the imagination of the condemned man, no one died and they all learned a salutary lesson.

The Gospel scene could have ended in a very ugly manner. If Jesus had gone along with the script of the Scribes and Pharisees, the woman would have died a horrible death. Who would have benefited from that? Instead, thanks to the understanding and compassion he showed her, she was able to put it behind her and make a new start.

The fact that he didn't condemn her does not mean that he thought lightly of adultery. He realized that she had already been condemned. What she needed now was compassion. He treated her in such a way that it made her want to reform her life.

What God wants is not the death of the sinner but that he/she be converted and live. In his wisdom God understands our weakness, and in his mercy he forgives our sins. He not only helps us to put our sins behind us, but to draw good from them. And surely the fact that we have all sinned, and therefore stand continually in need of God's mercy, will make us refrain from casting stones at others.
