Reflection Giving and Receiving

I had a dream that the Lord was coming to my house as he came to the house of Martha and Mary. So I scrubbed it from top to bottom, cleaning and polishing everything. Then I set the table with the best tablecloth, best set of delf, best silverware, and put candles and flowers there too. As for food, I spared no expense. When all was ready and my quest was about to arrive, I rolled out the red carpet.

He came and I think I did him proud. I put on a great performance. I waited hand and foot on him. No king ever had such service lavished on him. I made sure that the conversation never flagged. He, for his part, was most gracious. He showed so much appreciation that I was embarrassed. Everything went off like clockwork. When he left I felt good, and yet something was bothering me.

For a while I was at a loss as to what this might be. Then a question arose within me: What did he want from me? Food? Hospitality? I wondered. But then I heard a second question sounding inside me: What was it that he wanted to give me? I felt sure that he wanted to give me something. But, whatever it was, I gave him no opportunity to give it to me. I created the impression that everything was perfect, and that I wanted for nothing.

Some people are very good at giving but extremely poor at receiving. Dr Marie de Hennezel setup a unit for the terminally ill in a Paris hospital. In her book, *Intimate Death,* she tells of a woman who was brought to the unit. The woman had helped everyone but now was unable to help herself. She always wanted to be given lots of love, and now in the hospital unit she was getting it in abundance. But it was so difficult to receive it. She talked about her family's love, and that of her friends and those who took care of her, as 'a fountain from which she didn't know how to drink'. She needed to learn how to become a child again, humble enough to accept a gift. But this was not easy because she was the absolute opposite: she loved to give egoistically.

Self-centered people hate to receive. Why is this? Because it makes them feel inferior to others and puts them in debt to others. On the other hand, they love to give because it inflates their ego, thereby (unconsciously perhaps) making them feel superior to others.

Giving is important. But so too is receiving. None of us is self-sufficient. All of us are incomplete. We need to receive from one another and above all from God. It's nothing less than tragic not to be able to receive. It's not enough to know how to give, we must also know how to receive. Both are graced activities.

The Gospel story shows the essential difference between Martha and Mary. Martha was not able to receive, Mary was. Mary offered the Lord the gift of an open mind and a receptive heart. Martha, on the other hand, while very good at giving was very poor at receiving. Even the Lord couldn't give her anything.




