Reflection: Sins versus sinfulness

The pharisee was completely unaware of his own sinfulness. He didn't think he had any sins at all. He wasn't a sinner like the rest of human kind. No. He was different. Therefore, instead of examining his own conscience and confessing his own sins, he examine the conscience of others and confessed their sins - greed, injustice, adultery, and so on.

Yet he had sins. In fact, he had very serious sins. His chief sin was that of pride. But he was also vain and self-righteous, and he despised others. His sins were not so much bad deed as bad attitudes. He had an attitude problem - as people say in America.

The tax-collector might well have confessed the sins of the Pharisee. But he didn't do so. He concentrated on himself, and left the sins of others between them and God. With radical honesty he laid bare his heart before God. He made no attempt to hide anything. He stood before God and, in all humility, said, 'Lord be merciful to me for I am a sinner.' As a result he went home at rights with God. 'The humble person's prayer pierces the clouds'

We can learn from both of them. Firstly from the Pharisee. In fact, there is Pharisee lurking in each of us. Like him we may be very conscious of the sins of others but blind to our own. It's easy to get into the habit of confessing the sins of others. But this is dangerous because if prevents us from looking at our own sin. Besides, it's impossible to weigh the sins of others without putting our own finger on the scales.

And we can learn from the tax collector. He shows us how to confess our sins. Even though we may not be conscious of any specific sins, each of us can still say in all truth, 'I am a sinner.'

Many people approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a prepared list of sins. Most of the things that appear on that list are trivial matter an don't wary much from one confession to the next. No attempt is made to get down to the roots of their relationship with God and other people. Too much emphasis is place on the sins, not enough on the fact of being sinner.

We too must be prepared to stand before God as sinner, as much in need of God's mercy as the ground is in need of rain. What we have to face is not the fact that we commit sins, but that we are sinners. We are sinful, but a condition in which we live. This is the great truth which the Tax -Collector grasped.

'Better a sinner who know he's sinner than a saint who knows he's a saint'. (Yiddish saying)
